

Purchasing and Installing Homewood Colors Best Practices



Homeland's Homewood colors are variegated with irregular patterns and streaks. A randomized streaking process makes every piece different. Although each named Homewood color begins with a controlled base color, due to the randomness of the streakers, even the background color appearance will vary throughout and between runs. Please be aware of this before ordering and installing Homewood. We have provided this list of information and best practices to assist in a satisfactory installation and end-user purchase experience.

Please provide the end-purchaser multiple samples or visual displays showing a range of variegation.

It is the installer's responsibility to properly establish and communicate the expectations of what the finished project will look like with the end-purchaser prior to installation.

In addition, it is the installer's responsibility to educate the end-purchaser of what qualifies as a manufacturing defect covered by Homeland's Limited Manufacturer's Warranty, along with any separate installation warranty provided by the installer. Homeland's warranty does not cover any part of the fence layout, design, or installation. Homeland expressly excludes warranty coverage for labor expenses.

It is suggested to include extra pieces for the end-purchaser to have on hand for future repairs.

With variegated colors, we cannot guarantee that replacement pieces purchased in the future will have the same visual appearance.

Please inspect all profiles carefully for obvious defects or anything unexpected prior to installation.

Before beginning any installation, the end-purchaser and the installer should examine all profiles to ensure they are acceptable. If any profiles are believed to be unacceptable, DO NOT INSTALL. Please contact direct supplier for further assistance.

Per industry standards, installation of profiles constitutes acceptance of visual defects.

Mix profiles to minimize color and pattern repetition.

It is highly recommended to "dry lay" pickets prior to installing them together. This will give the contractor and the end-purchaser an opportunity to adjust the pattern to the desired visual appearance and avoid any installation pattern mistakes.

During installation, it is important to frequently step back to look at each section as well as multiple sections to better observe the "whole picture" before installation is completed.
